



PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Faced with a strong demand for housing and with limited land reserve, the city has acquired a former military barracks released by the army in 1994. The land acquisition has enabled the city to expand its downtown and create urban continuity to the great boulevards. Indeed the former barracks is located at the junction of a 1950s' neighborhood and a 1980s' social area. The first district has an elderly population and rather better-off households. The second district is characterized by a younger population, with families and by larger housing units. Very close to the city centre, the project strengthens its commercial offering. Finally the project area presents some risks and nuisances related to ammunition deposits and petrol station in the army.

A consultation process with inhabitants was launched in 2000 by the municipality of Grenoble in order to define the objectives of the project:

- Implementing a high environmental quality approach and be ambitious on accessibility issues ;
- Developing an area steeped in history with a focus on outstanding architectural and natural elements,
- Contributing to the diversity of housing, giving priority to families,
- Meeting the current and future needs in terms of equipment, providing social, educational, sporting and cultural facilities,
- Encouraging activity and trade, with new tertiary, craft and commercial activities,
- Creating public spaces in connection with the city, promoting comfort, quality and accessibility
- Fostering active modes of transportation,
- Promoting continual improvement by evaluating energy consumption
- Ensuring sustainable financial management by positive balance.




